2. What did Rachels think is the primary deficiency of ethical egoism?
3. What was the "inversion of values" described by Nietzsche?
4. What did Hospers take to be the fundamental advantage of rule utilitarianism over act utilitarianism?
5. What did Bentham take to be the ways in which the quantity of pleasure can be measured?
6. What was Kant's "categorial imperative"?
7. Why did Ross introduce the notion of a <i>prima facie</i> obligation?

8. How, for Aristotle, is living the good life for a human being like playing the flute well?
